AMERICAN CLASSICS

The works on this disc offer a broad survey of American violin music. John Corigliano's Chaconne is a set of variations based on his music for the 1998 film The Red Violin, while Enescu's George Romanian Rhapsody No. 1 is a nineteethcentury fantasia on a traditional melody, here in an arrangement by the Hollywood film composer Franz Waxman, Waxman's own Tristan and Isolde Fantasia includes a demanding obbligato piano part, and originally formed an emotional climax to the 1946 film Humoresque. The disc closes with John Adams's hugely popular Violin Concerto, a virtuosic masterpiece in which the soloist almost never stops playing.
